Why are we having this meeting?

We are having the meeting because people are worried that you have behaved in a way and might continue to behave in a way that is harmful to others.

At the meeting we will all explain what we are worried about. We will also talk about what things are going well for you and your family.

We will discuss how best to keep you and others around you safe – we might need to make a plan with work for you, your family and other people who are involve with you to do.

If we make a plan we will have another meeting in 3 or 6 months' time to see how things are going and decided whether there are still worries about your behaviour.

Who will be at the meeting?

Most importantly, we would really like YOU to attend if you can and tell people at the meeting what you think about what has happened and what you think should happen now. You can have someone from our children's rights service to be there with you to help and support you if you like – ask your social worker to invite them. If you decide not to come to the meeting, it would be really helpful for you to tell the social worker or another adult what you would like people to know about you; or fill in the questionnaire at the end of this leaflet.

Other people coming to the meeting will be:

- Your parents or carers
- Someone from your school
- School nurse
- Other people who work with you; for example, your youth worker or YOS worker
- Sometimes the police
- Your social worker
- The chairperson

What will happen after today?

We might ask you or your family or carers to spend some time with a social worker or other worker talking about why people are worried about you and how you can make safe choices about your behaviour. We might also ask your parents and carers or staff at your school to put some extra rules in place to make sure that you and everybody around you are safe.

Your social worker should tell you as soon as possible what happens at the meeting.
