One Minute Guide: The Local Authority Designated Officer (LADO)

What is it?

The scope of the Local Authority Designed Officer (LADO) role is highlighted in chapter 2 of Working Together 2013 and defines the framework for managing cases that meet the following criteria, when it has been alleged that a person who works with children has:

- Behaved in a way that has harmed a child, or may have harmed a child;
- Possibly committed a criminal offence against or related to a child; or
- Behaved towards a child or children in a way that indicates they may pose a risk of harm to children.

Why are we doing it?

The role ensures that all allegations or concerns about professionals or adults working or volunteering with children are recorded appropriately, monitored and progressed in a timely and confidential way. It gives all agencies whether from the statutory, private or voluntary sector a central point of contact for them to discuss and refer concerns falling within the above criteria.

All cases will be subject to an initial evaluation and where necessary involvement of other sectors including Ofsted, the police and social care when appropriate. The initial evaluation will focus on the nature of the concern, safeguarding for the particular child and appropriate consideration for the member of staff/volunteer concerned.

When is it happening?

The LADO function already exists within Redbridge and the majority of referrals made within the Borough come from Education and Social Care but an increasing number are now made by other sectors including Fostering Agencies, Early Year's settings and the Police.

Where is it happening?

The LADO is based within the Safeguarding and Care Planning Team
