Child A lives at home with her Mum ([REDACTED]), Sister ([REDACTED]) and Niece ([REDACTED]). Niece is subject to a CP plan under the category of sexual abuse because of sexual convictions against children, which her father, holds. Niece has no contact with her father until all the specialist risk assessments are completed and it is deemed safe for her to do so.

However, Sister has shared that she wishes to resume a relationship with Niece's Father and wants Niece to have unsupervised contact with him.

Child A has also suffered sexual abuse by her brother, who is currently serving a custodial sentence because of this. Child A is vulnerable and there have not been any appropriate ability to protect assessments completed of Mother, and although Brother is not due for release as of yet, there are concerns that because of Sister's views, where she does not acknowledge the risk Niece's Father poses, she is not deemed a safety factor and appropriate assessments needs to be completed for Mother and potentially Sister in relation to Niece's Father.

**Part 2 - Write Up**

Analysis of information

**Case allocation – hypothesis / reflections:**

Further ability to protect assessment is required by anybody who would be supervising contact between Child A and her Brother-in-law, Niece's Father who is convicted of sexual offences against children. Exploration into what information Child A knows about Niece's Father and whether this should be shared with Child A for her to be more informed regarding any further contact she has. Child A has been a victim of sexual abuse by her brother, Brother and is therefore likely to be more vulnerable.

Action	<p><b>Actions:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Read Referral and MASH Assessment in full – <b>by 05.10.2020</b></li> <li>- Liaise with allocated social worker for Niece to share information and establish if they have completed an Ability to Protect Assessment of Sister – <b>by 06.10.20</b></li> <li>- Liaise with sex offender manager for Niece's Father and probation worker to establish the risks he poses – <b>by 08.10.20</b></li> <li>- Joint Home visit to be completed with Exp SW/Snr Prac to share and obtain Induction Pack and consent for C&amp;F Assessment - <b>by 09.10.2020</b></li> <li>- Establish who Brother's partner is and if she has children. If she does, referrals will need to be made to MASH (MASH unable to find on Protocol. She could reside in Warwickshire, so may need to notify their MASH) – <b>by 09.10.20</b></li> <li>- Add Case Summary (following Recording Guidance) – <b>no later than 1 day after initial home visit</b></li> <li>- Ensure Chronology is up-to-date and clear – <b>12.10.2020</b></li> <li>- Explore Child A's relationships and complete at least three generational genogram and upload to her file. Be clear who Child A has contact with within the family network, identify any other risky adults within the family network, and any safe family members who are able to support the family. Ascertain Child A's understanding about Niece's Father and consider whether this should be shared with her to be more informed regarding any further time she spends with Niece's Father – <b>by 12.10.20</b></li> <li>- Check Point 1 to be completed with [REDACTED] (Experienced Social Worker) – <b>by 16.10.2020</b></li> <li>- Establish when Brother will be released and consider what, if any, risk assessments can be completed/started now, as we know he is a risk and is a convicted offender – <b>by 30.10.20</b></li> <li>- Check Point 2 and CF15 Case discussion with [REDACTED] – <b>by 30.10.2020</b></li> <li>- Ability to Protect Assessments to be completed of parent alongside C&amp;F Assessment ready for quality assurance by [REDACTED] (Snr Prac) to include mother's family history and wider family networks given Child A was sexually abused by her brother, who also sexually abused the cousin. Have there been previous risky adults in the home which mother has allowed contact with the children? – <b>by 06.11.2020</b></li> <li>- C&amp;F Assessment to be completed for quality assurance by [REDACTED] – <b>by 06.11.2020 (25 days)</b></li> <li>- Undertake C&amp;F Assessment under statutory requirements and consider the below points – <b>by 20.11.2020 (35 day)</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>* Ensure Child A's voice is ascertained via age and stage appropriate direct work, and that she is given the opportunity to speak freely to the Social Worker.</li> <li>* Explore parents' history. i.e. current and past relationships, living history, childhood trauma which could impact on parenting capacity. Ask parents about any childhood experiences of sexual abuse.</li> <li>* Ascertain mother's views of the concerns.</li> <li>* Establish Child A's father's details and include in C&amp;F Assessment (consider any risk/threat to Child A and mother before doing so).</li> <li>* Consideration into whether Child A requires any further therapeutic work given her experiences - has she applied for victim compensation?</li> <li>* Assess what life is like for Child A.</li> <li>* Ensure all relationships are added and linked on Child A's file.</li> <li>* Ensure home environment and child's bedroom are viewed and assessed as appropriate.</li> <li>* Explore the involvement of professionals/agencies working with/supporting the family. What are their views of the assessment of risk and need regarding Child A?</li> <li>* Complete a Signs of Safety mapping with the family, encouraging them to think about what is working well? What are they worried about? and What needs to happen/ change?</li> <li>* Complete Danger Statements and Safety Goals with the family (these can be completed in draft first before discussing with the family).</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
