Welcome to the Children & Young People's Suite.

There are lots of reasons you might be here today.

You might have told somebody that someone has hurt you or somebody might be worried about you.

Sometimes your private parts (girls bits or boys bits) might be sore.

What will happen today?

You will meet a doctor at your visit and also a nurse or a crisis worker.

We have lots of toys for you to play with or you can choose a DVD to watch, or play on the iPad.





The doctor will talk to the grown up that came with you and will also want to talk to you. You can ask the doctor any questions you like.

The doctor will need to look at your body to make sure that you are ok.

The grown up that came with you will stay with you if you want them to.

The doctor might use a special camera to look at your private parts so we can check if you are hurt or sore.

The check-up will not hurt at all but if you feel uncomfortable or you are upset just let the doctor know and they will stop.

What happens next?

Once you have finished seeing the doctor, you can go back to play with the toys, watch TV and have a snack.
