

MANAGEMENT OF GENITAL HERPES SIMPLEX IN CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE

Herpes Simplex is a virus that may infect the skin (including the genitalia) or mucous membrane in various parts of the body – commonly in the form of "cold sores" – often around the mouth. It causes clusters of painful blisters or sores. It also causes a systemic illness in babies who are vertically infected

Genital Herpes Simplex is transmitted through skin to skin contact with Herpes blisters or ulcers. It can also be acquired through asymptomatic viral shedding. In adults, it is usually sexually transmitted. The evidence base in children is small but suggests sexual contact to be the source in most cases, although horizontal transmission is possible. The virus can survive for long periods in cells in the body before becoming an activate infection.

If, after an appropriate risk assessment, a sexual health professional is assured that a young person aged 13 years and over, presenting with genital Herpes Simplex, is involved in a consensual relationship with a similar aged partner, it is not necessary to refer to Children's Social Care. For younger children, or if there are any concerns, referrals / discussions should take place appropriately, as indicated in the flow chart.

Because it is acutely painful, it may be necessary to delay any genital samples for other sexually transmitted infections and it is preferable to defer detailed genital examination by EMCYPSAS for 4 – 6 weeks until healing has taken place, as examination in the acute phase will be distressing for a child or young person.


