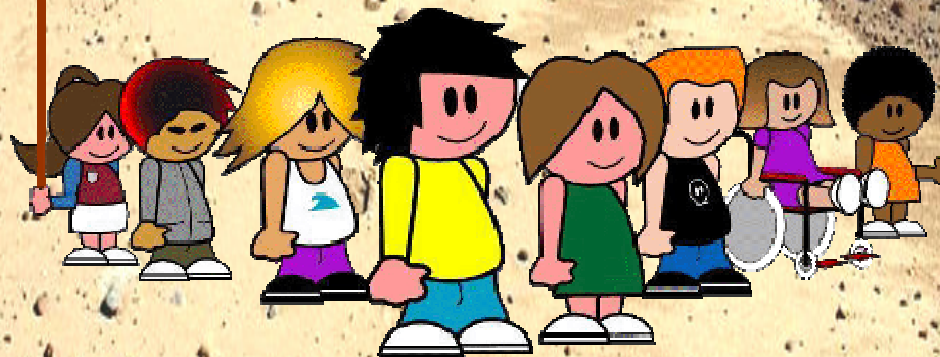

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How is Fostering for you?

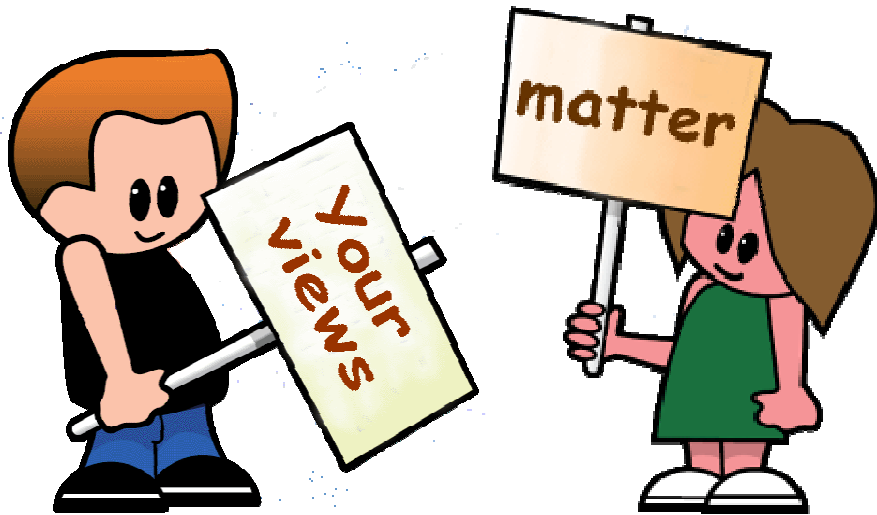
At least once every year, foster carers have to have a review. This is to make sure that fostering is still the right thing for them to do, and that they are looking after fostered children in the right way.

As you are being looked after by a foster carer, the law says we need to ask for your views.

It is your chance to tell us how fostering is for you, what's good about it, or what you find difficult.

The information you give will normally be shared at the foster carers review.

There is more information on the back page about who you can contact if you want to talk to someone in person, or if there is something you want us to know, but you would not want to be raised at the review.

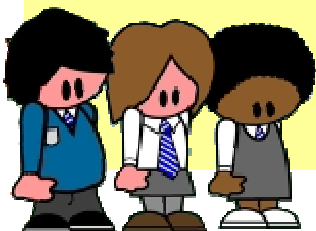

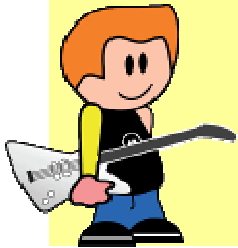
